For each topic, the teacher will present the contents which may be the most challenging for students (large group class). For each topic an average time of 3 hours is estimated.

The corresponding material and/or procedural instructions for each activity and practical exercises to be completed will be available on the virtual platform Prado 2 before the relevant session.

The material for each topic must be read in advance by students so that they can ask questions in the classroom and thus support their learning. The format of theoretical classes will be of an explanatory nature, where a brief presentation of the contents included in the theoretical programme will be given, and the necessary material considered appropriate for its development (slides, reading references, etc.) will be provided, so students can have the most complete training possible in each of the topics dealt with.

Practical Syllabus

Students must create a subject glossary. For each topic, a practical session will be allocated to discussing and sharing the key concepts which will make up the subject glossary and which should be uploaded in advance by students to Prado 2. The objectives and work procedure to create the glossary will be specified in a separate glossary guide. The glossary will be created in groups.

Seminars will also be proposed, each one touching upon one of the classic fields of application for Social Psychology: legal, health, gender, family, immigration, politics and environmental. The work team must proceed to carry out a literature search and read the reference material on a specific topic as well as designing a research or intervention proposal which would help to solve a social problem from those suggested.
